Division 3 – Commercial Field Peas & Lentils (Certified)

Points Awarded: Blue 20, Red 15, White 10

Rules:

- Only peas and lentils harvested/grown from foundation, registered or certified seed planted will be eligible for entry in the classification.
- One quart thresher run

Division 4 – Commercial Field Peas and Lentils (Uncertified)

Points Awarded: Blue 20, Red 15, White 10

Rules:

- Only peas and lentils harvested/grown from seed planted will be eligible for entry in the classification.
- One quart thresher run

Division 5 – Grasses and Oil Seeds

Points Awarded: Blue 20, Red 15, White 10

Rules:

- Either certified, or uncertified grass, and oil seeds harvested/grown from seed will be eligible for entry in the classification.
- One pint of thresher run seed, by variety, shall constitute an exhibit.

Division 6 – Sheaves: Grain

Points Awarded: Blue 20, Red 15, White 10

Rules:

- To be exhibited by variety.
- All sheaves shall meet requirements of General Rules in Open Class.
- Any one exhibitor may exhibit one sheaf per variety of grain.

Whitman County Association of Wheat Growers Field to Table

Cash prizes to the top three 4H or FFA wheat sheaf exhibits

- Open to any 4-H or FFA youth.
- An entry will consist of one quart of cleaned, threshed, soft white wheat; one wheat sheaf or soft white wheat, and four (4) blueberry muffins made, using ground, soft white wheat flour.
- Muffins should be entered on an 8" paper plate and enclosed in a zip lock or plastic tie bag.
- Recipe for muffins must accompany exhibit on a 3x5 card.

(NOTE: Baked entry may vary from year to year at superintendent's discretion.)

Entries will be judged on the following:

- Quart of Grain – Purity as to variety and freedom from weed seed, other grains and foreign matter.
- Wheat sheaf – General attractiveness and proper construction as per exhibit book instruction.
- Four (4) Blueberry muffins – taste and texture, proper use of ingredients.

Junior Wheat King

Awarded: \$100.00 (In Premium Check)

How to Enter: 4-H and FFA members growing wheat as an approved project may enter the Junior Wheat King Contest. One (1) quart of thresher run wheat and a signed letter from advisor or leader stating that exhibitor carried wheat as an approved project is required for entry in this contest. Only one grain entry can be made by an exhibitor for each variety.

Junior Barley King

Awarded: \$100.00 (In Premium Check)

How to Enter: 4-H and FFA members growing barley as an approved project may enter the Junior Barley King contest. One entry allowed by an individual for either 4-H or FFA. One (1) quart of thresher run barley and a signed letter from advisor or leader stating that the exhibitor carried barley as an approved project is required for entry in this contest. Only one grain entry can be made by an exhibitor in each variety.
