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PNW 327– Drying Fruits & Vegetables

- All canning exhibits shall be labeled with 4H labels obtained from the Extension Office.
- Labels should be placed on the top of the ring. Label includes:
 - Kind of food
 - Type of pack (raw or hot)
 - Processing method used (i.e., pressure canned or water bath)
 - Time processed (adjustments for high altitudes)
 - Date processed (should be since last Fair)
 - The Exhibitor's Registration number.
 - Indicate on label for canned tomatoes if citric acid or lemon juice has been added (e.g., "1 Tbsp. Lemon juice per quart")
- Products canned at 2,000 ft. altitudes will need additional processing as described in above USDA and WSU publications.
- All jars shall be exhibited without rings except jam and jelly.
- You may enter more than one jar in any class, as long as a different product.
- Judges may open jam and jelly jars.

- All dried food exhibits shall be labeled.
- The label should be placed as close to the bottom of the front of the package as possible.
- See EB 700 for packaging suggestions.
- The label should be a maximum of 2 ¼ inches high and 3 ½ inches long.
- Information on the label should tell the kind of food, method of drying (oven, sun, dehydrator), drying time, pretreatment used (if any), date dried (should be since last fair), and Exhibitor's Registration number.
