General Rules and Regulations

- Poultry entries are to be received by the Fair Office no later than August 1st.
- All exhibits will be placed by 8:00 p.m. Wednesday and are not to be taken out until after 4:01 p.m. Sunday
- Superintendents will not be responsible for poultry that remain after 7:00 p.m. Sunday
- All animal entries (except hen and chicks) shall be a minimum of 16 weeks old.
- Every exhibitor MUST sign up & complete barn duty.
- All entries shall be entered by breed.
- Poultry must be free of parasites.
- All poultry is subject to veterinary inspection.
- Superintendents reserve the right to limit entries per exhibitor.
- All poultry will be dusted for mites.
- Superintendents will feed poultry. Feed is provided by Four Star Supply, Inc.

Poultry Pullorum Testing

All chickens, exotic fowl, and game birds must test negative for Pullorum-Typhoid within 90 days prior to exhibition. Waterfowl, doves, and pigeons are exempt from this rule. Exhibitors are exempt from this rule if they are members of NPIP, or within the last 12 months, have purchased their show birds from a NPIP participating producer or a feed store that purchased their chicks from a NPIP participating

producer. Please include a copy of your test results or NPIP exemption with your entry form.

Division 7 – Costume Contest

Points Awarded: 1st 20, 2nd 10, 3rd 5

Rules:

- All exhibitors will compete for overall 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place rosettes for a costume involving themselves and their poultry.

Division 8 – Judging

Points Awarded: Blue 20, Red 10, White 5

Rules:

- Exhibitors are eligible to compete in judging.
- A judging class will be made up of four birds.
- Each participant will handle and examine the poultry and place according to the quality and standards, using the Hormel scoring system.
- All participants will receive a ribbon.

Division 9 – Egg Contest

Points Awarded: Blue 20, Red 10, White 5

Rules:

- Each entry shall consist of 1 dozen chicken eggs with natural shell that is not oiled or treated otherwise.
- One entry per exhibitor.
- Eggs should be weighed prior to fair entry.
