General Rules and Regulations

The Palouse Empire Fair supports the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and by exhibition at this fair, all exhibitors agree to be bound by same rules and regulations.

- Cattle to be exhibited are to be entered by August 1st. Additional entry blanks may be obtained from the Fair office.
- All cattle are to be on the grounds by 8:00 p.m. Wednesday. Cattle entries are not to leave the Fairgrounds until 4:01 p.m. Sunday. This includes any decorations/displays used as part of the exhibit.
- Open Division beef cattle judging will start at 8:30 am Friday.
- The Palouse Empire Fair does not charge a stall fee. The Fair Association will furnish bedding. Each exhibitor is encouraged not to waste bedding material. Exhibitor will furnish his/her own feed.
- All entries must be registered with their respective breed associations and registration papers and tattoos will be checked prior to showing.
- All females over 4 months must be Brucellosis vaccinated prior to the Fair and display proof thereof.
- No Nurse Cows Permitted
- All animals shown in-group classes must have been shown in their respective single age class.
- There will need to be more than 10 head per breed to award the Division Champion ribbons.
- Females competing in Class 11 must have a natural born calf at side or furnish a non-owner veterinarian's statement of her pregnancy.

5. Summer yearling heifer, calved between July 1 and August 31, prior year.
6. Late spring yearling heifer, calved between May 1 and June 30, prior year.
7. Early spring yearling heifer, calved between March 1 and April 30, prior year.
 - a) Junior Champion female, from classes 5, 6, and 7 (Ribbon)
 - b) Reserve Champion female from classes 5, 6, and 7 (Ribbon)
8. Junior yearling heifer, calved between January 1 and February 28, prior year.
9. Senior yearling heifer, calved between September 1 and December 31, prior year.
 - a) Senior champion female, from classes 8 and 9 (Ribbon)
 - b) Reserve senior champion female from same Ribbon
 - c) Grand Champion female Rosette
 - d) Reserve Grand Champion female Rosette
 - e) Champion and Reserve Champions from classes 1-9 compete for the Rosettes
10. Two females bred & owned by exhibitor.
11. Cow/calf pair
12. Late junior bull calf, calved on or after March 1st.
13. Early junior bull calf, calved January and February, current year.

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14. Winter bull calf, calved between November 1 and December 31, prior year.
15. Senior bull calf, calved between September 1 and October 31, prior year.
 - a) Bull calf champion from classes 12, 13, 14, and 15 (Ribbon)
 - b) Reserve bull calf champion from same Ribbon
16. Summer yearling bull, calved between July 1 and August 31, prior year.
17. Late spring yearling bull, calved between May 1 and June 30, prior year.
18. Early spring yearling bull, calved between March 1 and April 30, prior year.
19. Junior yearling bull, calved between January 1 and February 28, prior year.
 - a) Junior champion bull, from classes 16, 17, 18 & 19 (Ribbon)
 - b) Reserve junior champion bull from same Ribbon
20. Senior yearling bull calved between July 1 and December 31, prior year.
21. Two year old bull, calved between January 1 and June 30
 - a) Senior Champion bull, from classes 20 & 21 (Ribbon)
 - b) Reserve senior champion bull, from same Ribbon
 - c) Grand champion bull Rosette
 - d) Reserve Grand Champion bull Rosette
- e) Champions and Reserve Champions from classes 12-21 compete for the Rosettes.
22. Two bulls, bred and owned by exhibitor.
23. Three bulls owned by exhibitor
24. Pair of calves. One bull from classes 12, 13, 14, 15 and one female from classes 1, 2, 3, 4: Must be bred and owned by exhibitor.
25. Pair of yearlings. One bull from classes 16, 17, 18 and 19 and one female from classes 5, 6, 7 or 8: Must be bred and owned by exhibitor.
26. Produce of dam, two animals, either or both sexes represented born to dam, either natural or a result of embryo transfer, bred and owned by exhibitor.
27. Junior Get-of-sire, three animals by one sire, both sexes represented, shown in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 and 12, 13, 14, 15 or 16.
28. Get-of-sire, four animals by one sire, any age, either or both sexes.
29. Best four head, owned by exhibitor.
