### General Rules and Regulations

- Official Scrapie Tag/Tattoo
- Requirements By order of the Washington State
  Department of Agriculture, effective May 16,
  1999, all female sheep and intact breeding
  males must be identified with an official WSDA
  Scrapie Flock Identification Tag or tattoo prior to
  being admitted for exhibition or sale at the
  Palouse Empire Fair. This requirement is in
  compliance with Washington Administrative
  Code (WAC) Chapter 16-89 "Sheep and Goat
  Scrapie Disease Control". Listed sheep without
  proper identification will be refused entry into
  the Palouse Empire Fair.
- No washing of sheep at the Fair without permission of the Sheep Superintendent.
- Lamb Tail Docking: Scientific research indicates that the incidence of rectal prolapse is reduced when the tail is docked in a non-extreme manner. Complete tail removal (extreme docking) is not an accepted sheep production practice and will be discouraged at the Palouse Empire Fair. In order to determine extreme docking, the gray tail docking measuring device will be used. The device will be raised in a vertical plane and should catch enough tail to lift: this is comparable to two fingers width. A violation has occurred if there is inadequate tail to lift. The exhibitor will be informed with a correction expected for future Palouse Empire Fair participation.
- Sheep entries are to be made to the Fair office no later than August 1<sup>st</sup>.
- All exhibits are to be on the grounds by 8:00 p.m., Wednesday. The Fair Association will furnish bedding. Each exhibitor is encouraged not to waste bedding material. Exhibitors will furnish their own feed and feed boxes. A trim stand area is available for exhibitors.

### Class:

- 1. Ram, one year and under two
- 2. Ram lamb, under one year
  - Grand Champion ram over all, any age -Rosette
  - Reserve Grand Champion ram over all, any age- Rosette
- 3. Ewe, one year and under two
- 4. Ewe, under one year
  - Grand Champion ewe over all, any age-Rosette
  - Reserve Grand Champion ewe over all, any age- Rosette
- 5. Mature ewe, over two

Points Awarded: 1<sup>st</sup> 60, 2<sup>nd</sup> 40, and 3<sup>rd</sup> 25

- 6. Flock, consists of one ram, any age; two yearling ewes and two ewe lambs
- 7. Pair of ram lambs
- 8. Pair of ewe lambs
- 9. Pair of yearling ewes

# <u>Division - 5 – Costume Class</u> No Points Awarded:

### Rules:

- This division is open to all youth and adults within the Sheep Department and is designed for the exhibitor's enjoyment and a chance to show off their creativity and imagination, while protecting the sheep from harm and cruelty.
- Classes will be arranged by age, starting with the youngest, up to adults, who will have to make arrangements to borrow a lamb from a youth within the Sheep Barn prior to the event. No sheep will be allowed to be brought onto the fairgrounds after the fair has begun.
- No spray paint, glitter, glue or other adhesives will be allowed on the lambs.
- Remember, they cannot be washed afterward!
   Halters will remain on the lambs while being shown.

### <u>Division 6 - Parents to the Halter</u>

This event is for entertainment purposes only, no money or points will be earned, but a reward to the winners is possible. Please sign up during the Fair.

- This Division is open to all adults within the Sheep Department and is designed for the enjoyment of both the exhibitor and the audience.
- Adults may borrow a lamb from within the sheep barn, with the permission of the lamb's true exhibitor.
- There will be only one class. Judging is based on the same rules as fitting and showing.
